Robert H. Mulz, more commonly known as Bob, was born at home on 16 July 1944 in Brooklyn N.Y. As the Vietnam War heated up, Mulz was called to active duty in March 1966, in June of 1967 he joined the guided missile destroyer USS Henry B. Wilson DDG7 which then was followed by several deployments in the "ugly war" in Southeast Asia aboard USS Robison DDG12 and USS Hoel DDG13. 1973 brought him orders to hand selected the group called "ILDG" (Individualized Learning Development Group) The team was charged with writing the basic electricity and electronics course for the US NAVY and COAST GUARD. Many of the learning materials developed are still being used today in the instruction of today's modern NAVY. Later Robert Mulz developed a Soviet and third world threat brief for The FleetCombatSystemTrainingUnit Pacific and traveled throughout the world on independent duty providing vital tactical information to the entire US Naval Fleet. Spent final days of career in the establishment of the Tomahawk Tactical Qualification Team, later known as the Cruise Missile Tactical Qualifications Team (CMTQT) which included Harpoon Missiles Qualifications and working directly for Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS) on qualifying shipboard commands in the deployment of the US NAVY only surface nuclear weapon. Retired after 27+ years, distinguished and honorable service as a Master Chief Fire Control Man (E-9). He received two NAVAL Commendation medals and five NAVY achievement medals with combat V for superior service along with many medals and other personal letters of commendation.

Bob, in addition to being a successful small business owner and community activist, he was elected President of The San Diego Elite DVBE Network in October 2002.

As a result of Bob's dynamic leadership and sound judgment, the Network has been recognized, by both State and Federal entities concerned with veteran affairs, as the most well organized and effective organization of its type in the Nation As a result, Bob's counsel has enabled over 40 chapters of the Elite to be established and are now serving SDVOB'S in over 35 states and Puerto Rico. There are several other states that are in the process of establishing and they should be incorporated under the 501-C19 umbrella by the mid year of 2010.

Bob continues to own and run a successful small business now in its 21st year under his management.
